





Director's Note


"The game is afoot!" was first uttered by the world's greatest detective in The Adventure of the Abbey Grange, part of The Return of Sherlock Holmes, a collection I had read not long after I turned ten years old. When Sir Arthur Conan Doyle presented the character in A Study in Scarlet over 130 years ago, he wouldn't likely have realized that he would live on in some 25,000 adaptations on page, stage, and screen by 1990. This presentation is an extremely faithful adaptation, fit for any Holmesian expert, as adapted by Jon Jory of the Actors Theatre of Louisville. The script has added little more than what was originally written, and the dialogue has been left virtually unchanged. Four individual mysteries, four separate casts of characters, four unique sets of Holmes, Watson, and the iconic characters who flock to Baker Street. This means four incredible interpretations of the character to highlight the many facets of the sleuth; something for the Downey Jr, the Cumberbatch, the Cushing, and the Rathbone fans in each actor. Watch as the actors seamlessly pass the gauntlet of the character off to one another onstage to explore the brilliant, daring, witty, and empathetic elements of the man. I have been extremely honored to work alongside all of these student actors on a project which means so much to me. Each of them brought varying levels of background knowledge to the project, and they all ended with masterfully interpreted performances of their characters that couldn't have done more justice to the story. Despite the long and winding road it has taken to get this production to where it is in this complicated year for Auburn Area Community Theatre, the work you're going to watch tonight is the welcome product of countless dedicated hours from often thankless hands of labor for all of our benefit. I have been endlessly grateful to serve as director, and I hope, sincerely, you enjoy the show.
